The University of Central Asia was founded in 2000 by the governments of Kazakhstan, the Kyrgyz Republic and Tajikistan, and His Highness the Aga Khan, and is the world's first internationally chartered institution of higher education. UCA was created to offer an internationally recognized standard of higher education in Central Asia and create knowledgeable, skilled and creative graduates who will contribute leadership, ideas and innovations to the transitioning economies and communities of the region. The mission of UCA is to promote the socio-economic development of Central Asia's mountain societies, while at the same time helping the diverse peoples of the region to preserve and draw upon their rich cultural traditions and heritages as assets for the future. UCA operates within a framework of values that espouses academic excellence, individual rights and security, responsibility to community and public service, and is committed to ethical and transparent practices.

UCA recently established the Mountain Societies Research Centre (MSRC), a University-wide research institution that seeks to generate, disseminate and promote the application of knowledge for the development of mountainous regions and their societies. The Centre aims to fulfill five complementary objectives:

1. Generate and disseminate relevant knowledge through sound research
2. Build Central Asian capacity to conduct research relevant to mountain societies.
3. Inform policy and practice through evidence-based research.
4. Become a knowledge hub in Central Asia for scholars, development practitioners and policymakers.
5. Inform UCA's mountain societies-oriented programmes.

The Mountain Societies Research Centre, along with other thematic research centres currently being established, will be the academic core of UCA in the next five-year period during which UCA is developing its undergraduate and graduate-level academic programmes.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- In collaboration with key internal and external stakeholders, lead the process of formulating and developing a research agenda related to the natural and social science MSRC theme of Environmental Change and Natural Resource Management dimensions of Sustainable Land Management and Natural Resource Governance.
- Define roles and responsibilities of and recruit research teams including post-doctoral research fellows, associate researchers from partner institutions, and development implementation-oriented collaborators.
- Lead research teams in the development of background papers and application-focused research proposals.
- Work closely with UCA's units to generate and manage external research grants.
- Develop the MSRC as a knowledge and resource hub for researchers, practitioners, and policymakers interested in mountain societies.

- Highly motivated to develop research teams and mentor researchers from the region, previous demonstrated leadership in collaborative research projects
- Flexibility and ability to work in a start-up environment of a new academic institution
