### **Nepal: Another bird flu outbreak confirmed in Lamthoki hatchery**

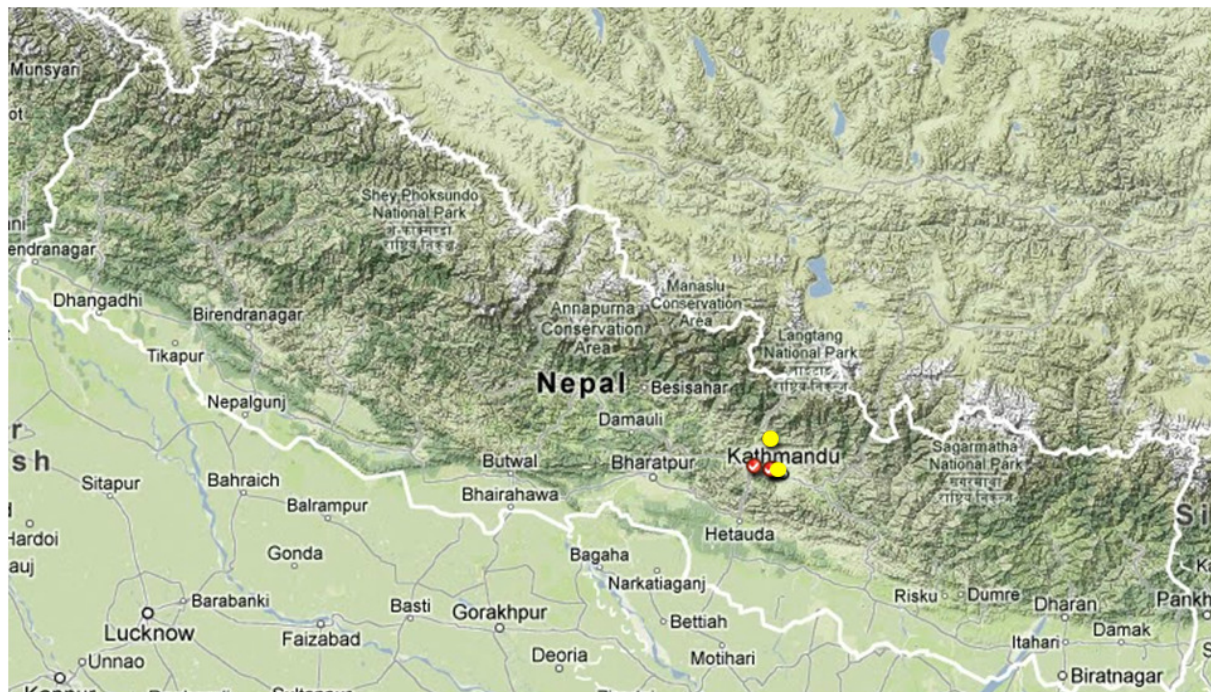

### **Pakistan: Mysterious disease killed 360 buffalo, cows and goats in Sindh**

Much to the horror of the animal bearers, the large number of deaths have been reported within a week in Ghotki, and Sukkur. According to the villagers buffaloes and cows feel congested in breathing and die in a short time span. The sudden death of buffaloes, cows and goats have forced the breeders to watch their means of livelihood die in front of their eyes. Moreover, some 1.5 million domestic animals are believed to be suffering from this unknown disease.
