China: Beijing reported second H7N9 human case

The National Health and Family Planning Commission, China notified WHO of an additional laboratory confirmed case of human infection with Avian Influenza A(H7N9) virus. The patient is a six-year-old boy reported from Beijing who became ill on 21 May 2013.

China: Update on H7N9 in poultry

Ministry of Agriculture has finished collecting and testing 899,758 samples from across most parts of the country. Of the total, 53 samples were found positive with H7N9. Fifty-one positive samples were from 18 live poultry markets in Shanghai, Anhui, Zhejiang, Jiangsu, Henan, Shandong, Guangdong, Jiangxi and Fujian. The other two positive samples were from a wild pigeon in Nanjing, and a domestic pigeon in Nantong, Jiangsu Province.
