China: Another FMD outbreak in Tibet

India: Suspected anthrax in Andhra Pradesh

Two suspected cases of dreaded anthrax have been reported from Vizag Agency. H.B. Appanna, 47, and H.B. Rajulamma, 35, were shifted from Araku to King George Hospital in the city for treatment. About two weeks ago, 25 tribal families, belonging to Kinchumanda in Dumbriguda mandal, consumed meat of a dead goat. After a couple of days, a few of them had ulcers on their fingers. As they approached the local hospitals, doctors initially prescribed antibiotics. [read more](#)

India: Anthrax in Odisha

Anthrax scare has gripped Angul district in Odisha with more than 35 people falling ill with suspected symptoms of the disease at Suleipal village under Kaniha block. Fifteen persons have been rushed to the SCB Medical College Hospital while the rest are being treated at the local hospital at Kaniha. All the affected persons are from the same village and are displaying symptoms of cutaneous anthrax infections, like severe lesions or wounds on the skin. [read more](#)

India: Rabies in Manipur
