



Call for Papers

In 2011, the Food and Agriculture Organization published a book: 'Save and Grow'. The challenge of Save and Grow is the focus of this conference:

"To feed a growing world population, we have no option but to intensify crop production. But farmers face unprecedented constraints In order to grow, agriculture must learn to save."

The phrase, sustainable crop production intensification (SCPI) was coined, a key component of which is soil health. Conservation Agriculture (CA) is producing food while mimicking the forest through minimum soil disturbance (no-tillage), continuous mulch, and diverse species; an approach which enhances soil health.

In this conference we are soliciting presentations about conservation agriculture production systems (CAPS) being developed in several regions of the world. We are seeking papers on CA research, teaching and extension.

PAPER SUBMISSION: To submit an abstract for consideration, please email the Program Chair, Dr. Victor Ella, at vbella100@yahoo.com with the following information: 1. An abstract of a length between 250-350 words (to fit one page of the proceedings); 2. Full paper if available.

An applicant needs to indicate the topic category the paper should belong to and whether s/he would like to present it orally or as a poster. Specifications for the posters are 90 cm wide, 120 cm high, with letter sizes readable from 2 m and with good mix of photos, diagrams, tables and maps. A number of distinguished posters will be honored.

Multiple submissions by the same author(s) are allowed and welcome, but please make separate submission requests. The deadline for abstract submission is October 31, 2013. Notification for abstracts acceptance will be given by November 7, 2013. Presenter must register within November 15, 2013 for abstract to be included in the conference program.

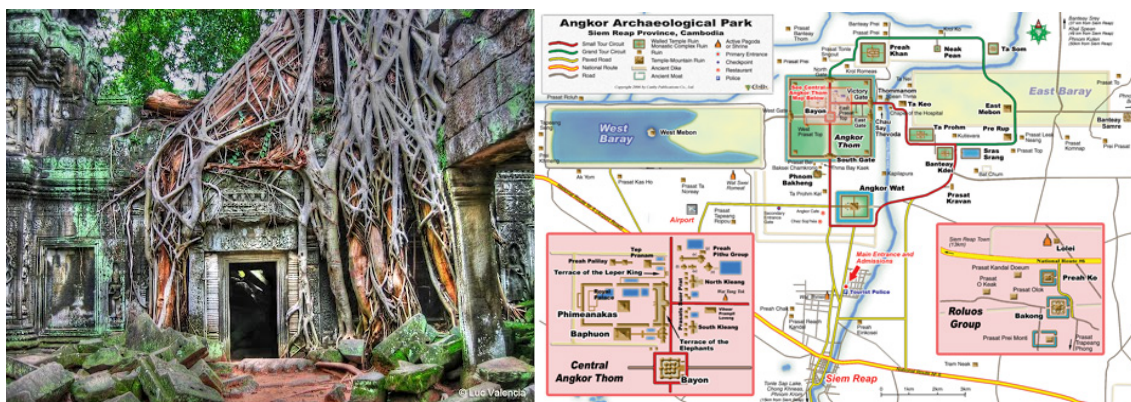
