Cambodia: Second confirmed H5N1 human case in 2014

The case was an 8-year-old boy from Kbal Trach Village, Sre Chea Commune, Snuol District, Kracheh Province was confirmed with H5N1 on 8 February 2014. He had fever, sore throat and runny nose on 31 January 2014, his parents sought treatment at a private clinic in the village. His condition worsened and was admitted to the hospital in Kampong Cham on 7 February, and died later on that day.

His sister developed similar symptoms on 1 February and was admitted to the same hospital with her brother. She died on the same day. No specimen was collected and therefore no test for H5N1 was conducted. There was a history of poultry died of in the village and the parents and the boy prepared dead chickens for food, while the girl stayed around and touch chickens. [read more](#)

Cambodia: Confirmed bird flu case in ducks in Kampong Cham

According to FAO field officer, 10 ducks from Svay Prey village, Sandek commune, Batheay District, Kampong Cham province were tested positive for H5N1. On 10 February 2014, Cambodia Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries had issued the Prakas but not yet notify to OIE.

China: 20 new confirmed H7N9 cases in Human including one imported case in Malaysia.

Most of the cases had history of either in-contact with poultry or live bird/farmer markets.

China: An outbreak of PPR in Inner Mongolia

China's Ministry of Agriculture (MOA) has confirmed an outbreak of peste des petits ruminants (PPR), also known as goat plague, in northwest China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region. On February 10, two villages in Bayannur City of Inner Mongolia reported that 1,063 goats had showed suspected symptoms of the disease and that 431 of them had died. China: A man died from rabies in Shanghai

A 20-year-old man died of rabies this morning after he was bitten by a stray dog early last month and failed to get treatment. His father said the man was bitten by a dog in early January and didn't receive any

Malaysia: First imported H7N9 human case

The Health Ministry has confirmed the first Influenza A (H7N9) case in the country, involving a female tourist from China. The import case involves a 67-year-old Chinese woman, who had travelled from Guangdong, China, to Kuala Lumpur on February 4. The woman went to Sandakan, Sabah the next day before going on to Kota Kinabalu on February 6. The woman was referred to a private hospital in Kota Kinabalu on February 7, and (after two screenings) on February 11, the sample tested positive for the Influenza A (H7N9) virus. [read more](#)

Viet Nam: Confirmed 6 outbreaks of H5N1 in six provinces

Four outbreaks of H5N1 were reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 13 February 2014. These outbreaks include:

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Giap Ha, Giao Ha, Giao Thuy, Nam Ding with 300 poultry died and 210 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Pho Cuong, Pho Cuong, Duc Pho, Quang Ngai with 600 poultry died and 1903 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Khanh Hoa, Khanh Hoa with 3000 poultry died and 3900 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Ben Cau, Ben Cau, Tay Ninh with 329 poultry died and 1253 destroyed.

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Tran Hoi, Tran Hoi, Tran Van Thoi, Ca Mau with 106 poultry died and 15 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Ngoc Hoi, Ngoc Hoi, Kon Tum with 2663 poultry died and 2572 destroyed. [read more](#)

Viet Nam: Confirmed 4 outbreaks of H5N1 in four provinces

Four outbreaks of H5N1 were reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 15 February 2014. These outbreaks include:

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Bao Thang, Bao Thang, Lao Cai with 206 poultry died and 6607 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Long An, Long An with 600 poultry died and 1903 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Dak Lak, Dak Lak with 865 poultry died and 765 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Hoa Xuan Dong, Hoa Xuan Dong, Dong Hoa, Phu Yen with 1100 poultry died and 900 destroyed. [read more](#)

Viet Nam: Suspected bird flu in Quang Ngai and Thanh Hoa Provinces

Nguyen Van Thuan, deputy head of the central Quang Ngai Province Veterinary Sub-department, said on Monday afternoon that his agency was focusing its efforts on preventing the spread of H5N1 avian influenza after detecting a large outbreak on a local farm in Phu Cuong Commune, Duc Pho District. About 1,800 chicken infected with the H5N1 virus on this farm have been incinerated, Thuan said.

In Thanh Hoa Province, local authorities reported that the H5N1 bird flu broke out in Tinh Gia District, killing nearly 200 ducks on a farm in Anh Son Commune. The provincial Veterinary Sub-department has taken samples of affected poultry for testing and the test results have confirmed the appearance of the H5N1 virus. [read more](#)

Viet Nam: Suspected bird flu in Quang Nam Province

The central province of Quang Nam officially declared an A/H5N1 avian flu outbreak on February 11. The deadly virus was detected in ducks at several Duy Xuyen and Thang Binh district households.
