Cambodia: 3 new confirmed H5N1 human cases

The first case was a 10-year-old girl from Roveang village, Knor Dambong Commune, Cheung Prey District, Kampong Cham Province. She had onset on 26 January 2014 with fever, running nose, cough and abdominal pain. She was admitted to hospital on 20 February after H5N1 confirmed. She recovered. There were dead ducks in duck farms in the village and the mother bought sick and dead ducks and prepared for food.

The second case was an 11-year-old girl from Laak Village, Krek Commune, Ponhea Krek District, Kampong Cham Province. She had onset on 9 February 2014 with fever, running nose, cough, sore throat and vomiting. She was admitted to hospital on 20 February after H5N1 confirmed. She recovered. All 30 chickens owned by the family died. [read more](#)

The third case was a 3-year-old boy from Prey Lvea Village, Sangkat Chom Chao, Khan Por Sen Chey, Phnom Penh. He had onset on 22 February 2014 with fever, running nose, cough and vomiting. She was admitted to hospital on 28 February. He died on 2 March 2014. There were about 90% of chickens and some ducks died in the village in mid February. [read more](#)

China: 9 new confirmed H7N9 cases in Human

Most of the cases had history of either in-contact with poultry or live bird/farmer markets.

Fujian: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

- 27-year-old man, migrant worker who lives in Qingkou, Minhou, Fuzhou, Fujian Province. His condition is mild. [read more](#)

Guangdong: 5 new confirmed human H7N9 cases

- 75-year-old man from Panyu, Guangzhou. He died on 1 March 2014. [read more](#)
- 39-year-old man from Nanhai, Foshan. His condition is severe. [read more](#)
- 88-year-old man from Yuexiu, Guangzhou. His condition is critical. [read more](#)
- 70-year-old man from Xingning, Meizhou. His condition is critical.

Hong Kong: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

- 18-month-old girl from To Kwan Wan. She travelled to Shunde, Foshan, Guangdong from 5-27 February 2014. She was brought to wet market during that time. She is in mild condition. [read more](#)

Jiangsu: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

- 36-year-old man from Xuzhou City. He is in critical condition. [read more](#)

Shandong: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

- 59-year-old man, farmer from Tai'an, Shandong Province. Before onset he worked as worker in Wuxi City, Jiangsu Province. He is in critical condition. [read more](#)

China: H7N9 deaths reached 72 in 2014

A total of 72 people died from the H7N9 bird flu strain in China in the first two months of this year, government figures showed, far more than in the whole of 2013. China reported 41 deaths and 99 cases of H7N9 avian influenza in February alone, the National Health and Family Planning Commission said in monthly figures for infectious disease, bringing the total cases this year to 226. The country recorded 46 deaths and 144 cases for 2013 in an outbreak which started early in the year and returned in the autumn. [read more](#)

China: Confirmed new H7N9 outbreaks in poultry

Three reported outbreaks of H7N9 were reported to OIE by the China Animal Disease Control Centre, Veterinary Bureau on 7 March 2014. These outbreaks include:

- Jinshabeilu Agriculture Products Market, Liuyang, Hunan. 50 samples were collected from the market (including 15 chicken samples, 16 pigeon samples and 19 environment samples). One specimen from pigeon was tested positive for H7N9.
- Chengbei Agriculture Products Market, Shuangfeng, Loudi, Hunan. 22 chicken samples were collected from the market. Two were positive for H7N9.
- Baijiaodazhong Agriculture Products Market, Doumen, Zhuhai, Guangdong. 60 samples were collected from the market (including 20 chicken samples, 20 duck samples and 20 goose samples). Six chicken samples were positive. [read more](#)

China: Confirmed new H5N1 outbreak in poultry in Yunnan

An outbreak of H5N1 was reported to OIE by the China Animal Disease Control Centre, Veterinary Bureau on 7 March 2014 with a total of 29,600 poultry died and 503,400 destroyed. The outbreak was in backyard poultry in Junction of three villages, Tonghai, Yuxi, Yunnan. [read more](#)

China: 3 new rabies cases confirmed in Taiwan

As of this week, a total of 332 rabies outbreaks involving 335 ferret-badgers, one Asian house shrew and a puppy bitten by a ferret-badger have tested positive for rabies infection, were reported by the Central Epidemic Command Centre reported on 5 March 2014, adding that the number of cities and counties that have confirmed cases of rabid animals remained unchanged at nine. Philippines: 3 people died from rabies in Surigao City in 2014

The Surigao City Health Office has reported three human rabies deaths since the beginning of the year, according to a Philippine Information Agency report Monday. City Health Officer Dr. Emmanuel A. Plandano said the victims were from different barangays of the city, "one 50-year old, male from Purok 10, Barangay Mabini died on January 22; one 8 year-old boy from Purok 5, Barangay Canlanipa died on February 11 and one 54-year old, female from Purok 1, Barangay Serna died last February 26." Viet Nam: Confirmed 7 outbreaks of H5N1 in poultry

Two outbreaks of H5N1 were reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 6 March 2014 with a total of 1,210 poultry died and destroyed. These outbreaks include:

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Binh Duong with 300 poultry died and 410 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Phuoc Thai, Phuoc Thai, Ninh Phuoc, Ninh Thuan with 300 poultry died and 200 destroyed. [read more](#)

Two outbreaks of H5N1 were reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 7 March 2014 with a total of 1,210 poultry died and destroyed. These outbreaks include:

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Can Tho with 500 poultry died and 7,012 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Hoa Lu, Hoa Lu, Plei Ku, Gia Lai with 160 poultry died and 571 destroyed. [read more](#)

An outbreak of H5N1 was reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 10 March 2014 with a total of 5,000 poultry died and 14,200 destroyed. The outbreak was in backyard poultry in Vinh Cuu, Vinh Cuu, Dong Nai. [read more](#)

Two outbreaks of H5N1 were reported to OIE by the Department of Animal Health on 11 March 2014 with a total of 4,056 poultry died and destroyed. These outbreaks include:

- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Dao Duc, Dao Duc, Vi Xuyen, Ha Giang with 70 poultry died and 44 destroyed.
- one outbreak in backyard poultry in Dien Ban, Dien Ban, Quang Nam with 2,000 poultry died and 2,056 destroyed. [read more](#)
