China: 3 new confirmed H7N9 cases in Human

Anhui: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

Jiangsu: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

- 51-year-old man from Zhenjiang City. He is in critical condition. [read more](#)

Jiangxi: 1 new confirmed human H7N9 case

Most of the cases had history of either in-contact with poultry or live bird/farmer markets.

China: Taiwan confirmed 3rd and 4th imported H7N9 cases

- 3rd case, Taiwan's Centers for Disease Control confirmed Tuesday the third imported case of H7N9 avian flu since April last year. The patient, a 44-year-old woman from China's Jiangsu Province, entered Taiwan April 17 as part of a tour group. She is currently in serious condition in a hospital intensive care unit. - 4th case, Taiwan's Centers for Disease Control (CDC) confirmed Friday the island's fourth imported case of H7N9 avian flu since April last year. The patient, a 39-year-old Taiwanese businessman, developed symptoms similar to that of H7N9 when he entered Taiwan on April 19, after traveling to Beijing and Kunshan in eastern China. X-ray test results on April 23 showed that he had pulmonary infiltration. He was then sent to a hospital for intensive care, the CDC said. [read more](#)

India: Rabies caused by wolf, monkey bites on the rise

When 40-year-old Suman Dyanadev Jadhav from Satara recently succumbed to a rabies infection in the city, her case was unlike the slightly more common ones treated by hospitals here. Jadhav had not contracted the dangerous infection from a dog — as is more wont to occur — but was instead the victim of a wolf bite that had caused the deadly condition. The case signals an increase observed by civic authorities in the number of rabies cases arising from bite wounds inflicted by animals other than dogs. In the four months of 2014 till date, the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) has recorded around 13 cases of rabies — most of them caused by dog bites. [read more](#)

Indonesia: Suspected bird flu in West Java

The Department of Forestry, Agriculture and Livestock (Dishutbunak) assumed the death of chickens in Panglayungan Hamlet, Panyingkiran Village, Panyingkiran Subdistrict, Tasikmalaya Regency, West Java the Majalengka due to bird flu. Based on field examination, Animal Health Dishutbunak, Siti Nurini explains that the characteristics of sudden death in chickens known to be positively infected by the H5N1 virus. Japan: Outbreaks of porcine endemic diarrhea

The Animal Health Division reported a total of 418 outbreaks of porcine endemic diarrhea to OIE on 24 April 2014. These outbreaks include Okinawa (4), Ibaraki (5), Kagoshima (156), Miyazaki (68), Kumamoto (20), Aichi (20), Aomori (10), Kochi (3), Tottori (unknown), Okayama (2), Saga (9), Oita (5), Fukuoka (4), Chiba (29), Nagasaki (6), Saitama (unknown), Mie (14), Kagawa (unknown), Ehime (2), Gunma (6), Tochigi (9), Niigata (13), Shizuoka (5), Fukushima (2), Toyama (2), Ishikawa (unknown), Yamagata (2), Hokkaido (3), Gifu (2), Fukui (unknown), Iwate (8), Akita (unknown), and Miyagi (3). Philippines: More on rabies in Negros Occidental

Rabies outbreaks have been declared in three cities and two towns in Negros Occidental after dogs from these places tested positive for the virus, Provincial Veterinarian Renante Decena, said yesterday. Records from the PVO covering January to April this year show that Bacolod City had four cases of rabies, Pulupandan town had two, Binalbagan town and the cities of San Carlos and Cadiz, one each. Philippines: Nine deaths due to rabies in Region 12

Health personnel in Region 12 have recorded nine suspected deaths due to rabies in the first three months of the year. Region 12, which is also known as Soccsksargen Region, comprises the provinces of South Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, Sarangani, North Cotabato and the cities of General Santos, Koronadal, Tacurong, Kidapawan and Cotabato. Dr. Teogenes Baluma, Department of Health (DOH) Region 12 director, said North Cotabato posted the highest number of rabies cases with four followed by Sultan Kudarat, three and South Cotabato and Sarangani provinces with one each.
