- **Contribute to and Improve** gender relations (equality and equity) in SSF for the benefit of all fisherfolk
- **Achieve** sustainable fisheries management by educating fisherfolk on acting responsibly to conserve resources
- **Provide** fisherfolk with guidance on policy influence and how to become more engaged in decision-making processes
- **Raise** awareness and provide policy support: knowledge products and outreach.
- **Improve** fisherfolk knowledge on the importance of their contribution to food security and poverty eradication
