Team FAO steps up on the podium at this year's Inter-Agency Games!

The UN family recently got together in Copenhagen for the 47th **United Nations Inter-Agency Games (UNIAG)**. It was the first event since 2019, following postponement due to the pandemic.

More than 1 200 enthusiastic participants from various UN agencies, including 30 from FAO, competed in 22 different disciplines (!).

Under the UNIAG flag, people from all over the world came together for four days of camaraderie, exchange, and friendly competition. The IAG is a great opportunity for colleagues from all agencies and organizations of the UN to get to know each other through the uniting power of sport, while strengthening the understanding of each other's mandates (and to have lot of fun!). Attending his fourth IAG, Lorenzo Gentile Colotta (DDC – and FAO football star!) enthusiastically said, "it's a great experience that everyone should live at least once in their lifetime! You get to meet many great people from different UN organizations in an environment of inclusivity, laughter and fun!"



The energy was infectious as Danielle Perpoli (ESP – FAO golf player extraordinaire!) reflected on the Games as, "truly a special occasion that allows us to meet our global colleagues." And Thomas Willems (PSR – FAO athletics dynamo!) reminisced on the joy that the Games bring, "sporting together, city tripping together and partying together. What's not to like? Meeting colleagues from all over the world and sharing this experience with them is truly unique and creates an amazing bond."

Fun and games aside, playing is serious and it got competitive. Team FAO meant business, proudly bringing home an impressive total of four gold and four silver medals! Padel tennis was played for the first time this year and FAO came in first place! Padel champion Edoardo Corriere (OIN) expressed his delight at attending the Games and collecting the gold medal, "we had a great time competing with colleagues from all over the world with whom we bonded immediately! Being a relatively small group, we enjoyed each other's company very much and look forward to next year!" His fellow gold medallist and padel partner Juan Henao Henao (OCB) shared his enthusiasm, "the IAG were indeed a wonderful experience to enjoy what I like to do in my free time (padel!), while joining colleagues from all the UN agencies."

FAO paired up with WFP forming an invincible duo on the Bellevue Beach, which hosted the beach volleyball. Stefano Anibaldi (FAO retiree) played with a colleague from WFP, overcoming all teams to clinch the gold medal.

Another gold, this time indoors, went to the FAO and UNEP table tennis women. Ayurzana Puntsagdavaa (RAP) said that after the win she, "was re-energised after participating in the Games."

Two's company, three's a team! The Organization joined forces with UNEP and OIOS to top the table at table tennis, as the men also won gold!

There were two more terrific trios who also made it onto the podium. FAO, IFAD and WFP who relayed together on the athletics track sprinted to a silver medal. The FAO tennis team rallied alongside ILO and IAEA and also earned the silver. The team hadn't been on the podium for many years, making them the surprise second-place winners for this tournament and Sara Holst (OED) a very proud captain!

The darts event brought together some of the Organization's best individual talent to form a competitive team, travelling to Copenhagen full of excitement and a desire to get on the podium! FAO focal point for the Games and darts captain Cora-Lee Canzian (OCC) said the recipe for success was, "our coordination skills, steady hand, and good aim for the bullseye!" The teamwork resulted in the dream work: they bagged the silver medal (and a wonderful trophy)! "All of us enjoyed the team spirit, fair play and we celebrated each member's performance while having so much fun." High-fives accompanied colleagues' accuracy on the board and, "showed not only the FAO darts team's competitive edge, but also our generosity in cheering all players to do their personal best!"

Making a splash in the pool, the swimming squad front crawled to victory, securing Team FAO's fourth silver medal! Aida Guardiola Sanchez (RAP – stellar swimmer) described the experience as, "truly awesome", explaining, "the vibe in swimming has been amazing and one UN united. I'm already impatient and motivated for the next UN Games!"
